He was born in Zaragoza on October 28, 1963.

Radio creative and sound designer. Expert in radio creativity and acoustic semiotics. Since 1980, he has been involved in the world of creativity and innovation in radio and digital media.

Currently, his work focuses on educational activities including courses and seminars on creative radio, workshops, and presentations on radio production and realization, sound experimentation, transmedia communication, radio art, and podcasts. He teaches courses on creativity, sound design, radio production, online radio, radial transmedia, and podcasts at both in-person and online universities and training centers.

He is the coordinator of the **Creative School of Radio TEA FM** (<u>www.teafm.net</u>) and responsible for launching various experimental initiatives. He has also been a program coordinator at Radio **Universidad San Jorge**. He is also responsible for Sound Design at the Hispanic-British company **Viva Voice** (<u>www.vivavoice.uk</u>) and **RESONAR Productions** (<u>www.resonarsound.com</u>)

Spanish is his native language. His passion for communication at all levels has led him to become proficient in other languages. He regularly uses English, French, Italian, and Aragonese, and expresses himself reasonably well in Catalan and Portuguese.

Experience

Founding member of Antena del Ebro (1980)

First associative station in Zaragoza created alongside José Luis Percebal and other professionals in Zaragoza's culture and communication field.

He began his professional career as a collaborator on specialized programs focusing on creativity and listener engagement. He introduced the concept of "Total Radio" adapted to the innovative FM at that time. Between 1982 and 1986, he collaborated with Radio Nacional de España and other national stations like **Antena 3 Radio** and **Radio 80** in informative and educational programs.

He also conducts roundtable discussions and conferences on free radios and alternative communication in Spanish and French cities.

At Radio 80, his production and realization work led him to share the microphone with Spanish cultural and entertainment figures in national programs such as "En el Aire" or "Tiempos Modernos." He also created various spaces for radio experimentation for this station.

On Antena 3 Radio, he hosted and presented weekend entertainment programs during local disconnection hours. On Sunday mornings, he developed a program featuring extreme situations for listeners, which was broadcast nationally as part of Jesús Hermida's show.

Together with the **University of Zaragoza** professor José Luis Rodríguez, the communicator Plácido Serrano, and other individuals linked to Aragonese culture, he launched **Radio Universidad** in the late 1980s, becoming an important breeding ground for media professionals.

He also teaches radio courses for high schools throughout Aragon, professional centers, and universities, in addition to delivering lectures on sound creativity and pedagogy.

He has conducted various seminars on radio and podcasts for the Government of Aragon's Communication Office and initiated the Creative Radio Workshop at TEA FM in 2008, introducing a new experience in Aragon for producing innovative radio products.

He collaborates with the Journalism degree program at the University of Zaragoza and other academic institutions in Aragon related to the media. In addition to directing and teaching podcast seminars for the training and launch of the Government of Aragon's news podcast channel, he leads courses on Radio Creativity and Production at the Advanced Technologies Center of Zaragoza, the city's Popular University, and the Communication Faculty of San Jorge University.

He was an online training professor in the Radio Area of the **Audiovisual Production Center CPA Salduie** in Zaragoza, where from 2009 to 2016, he taught distance courses on creative radio, radio production, realization, and podcasting, overseeing the Online Radio Postgraduate Program until its cancellation due to company strategies.

During the academic years 2017-2018 and 2018-2019, he was a professor in the **Radio Area of the Master's in Musical and Audiovisual Production** at the **Professional School of Advanced Music Xpresate**, Zaragoza.

He is the coordinator of the **TEA FM Radio School** and responsible for launching various experimental initiatives for the **Contemporary Culture Center of Barcelona**, the Association Zaragoza en Blanco, ZentrumClip of Ibercaja, and the Espacio Tangente of Burgos, among others. He has participated in events such as Zeppelín, Sonoscop, Sonoké, the International Radio Biennial in Mexico City, the Future Places Festival in Porto, the annual Air/Ear radio installation held in Santa Fé, Argentina, and the Sonor Festival in Nantes.

He maintains contacts and exchanges experiences with other radio workshops and Latin American universities such as **Radio UNAM** and **Radio Educación in Mexico**, the **Laboratory of Radio Art LEAR in Buenos Aires**, or Radio Universidad La Plata in Argentina. He regularly connects with individuals involved in radio art and sound art, such as José Manuel Berenguer (Director of the Chaos Orchestra under the **Contemporary Culture Center of Barcelona**), Luis Alvaz (experienced sound artist), Federico Volpini (RNE), and Sol Rezza (well-known sound designer and independent radio producer).

He collaborates permanently with the international experimental radio group **RADIA** through programs and experimental works broadcast on over 25 stations worldwide. He has participated in national and international contests and symposiums on sound creation and radio art, such as the AIR/EAR in Argentina, the **Deep Wireless Festival in Toronto** (Canada), the Sonor Festival in Nantes (France), and the **Third Coast Festival in Chicago** (USA).

Currently, in addition to his teaching duties for the **Advanced Technologies Center of INAEM** in Zaragoza, the University San Jorge of Zaragoza, the **Master's in Communication for Digital Media of COPE-USJ**, and collaborations with the **University of Navarra** and other Spanish and Latin American universities, he conducts creative research related to radio media. He is working on a thesis about advancements in interactivity in mass media, particularly in radio, exploring a new concept called Radio 3.0, and specifically, an experimental transmedia radio project named "Sound Hybrids."

He also dedicates himself to training and empowering workgroups for the creation and maintenance of radio media in rural areas. His projects include the recovery of the municipal radio station of Tarazona and workshops for children through the Aragonese Association of High Capacities, the audiovisual NGO Actuando, the Foundation for Help to Intellectual Disability of Aragón "Ser Más," FEAPS Aragón, Fundación Más Vida, UNRWA Spain, or the School of Cinema "Un Perro Andaluz."

He collaborates with the Faculty of Communication of the University San Jorge of Zaragoza and the Journalism Degree of the University of Zaragoza by giving masterclasses and specialized talks.

He leads the Radioplay team at the **TEA FM Radio School**, with which he has produced over a hundred audio fiction and radio theater works to date. Some notable adaptations include "The Martian Chronicles" by Ray Bradbury, "Without News of Gurb" by Eduardo Mendoza, "The Yellow Rain" by Julio Llamazares, "Copenhagen" by Michael Frayn, "Conversation with a Mummy" by E.A. Poe, "The Statement of Randolph Carter" by H.P. Lovecraft, or "What Fun They Had" by Isaac Asimov.

He has staged various live radioplay pieces and coordinates the project "Thursdays, Live Radioplay" at the Advanced Technologies Center of INAEM in Zaragoza.

He regularly collaborates with Escribit, a conference on Literature and New Technologies organized annually by the **Aragonese Writers Association**, conducting seminars on sound creation and scriptwriting for radio.

For the **International Film and Environment Festival of Zaragoza**, Ecozine, he conducts an annual workshop on sound design for short films within the "Recycled Planet Films" contest.

He initiated a project on **Sound Capture and Landscaping for the Department of Environment of the Government of Aragón** in the city of Zaragoza.

In November 2011, invited by the **University of the Basque Country**, he participated in the I International Congress of Audiovisual Communication and Advertising with a lecture on sound fiction and creativity in radio.

He is the organizer of the **International Congress of Radioplay and Sound Fiction** held annually in Zaragoza, Madrid, and various Latin American capitals.

He collaborates with **Radio Romania Actualitati** on international exchange programs.

He regularly participates in online discussions and roundtable discussions on various topics related to research in new forms of radio communication for Spanish and Latin American media.

He was a speaker at the 2nd Radio Conference organized by the Journalism Degree of the University of Zaragoza in February 2013.

He was responsible for the **Digital Radio Seminar at the Faculty of Communication of the University San Jorge** of Zaragoza in February, March, and April 2013.

He has conducted radio and sound fiction workshops, discussions with students, and masterclasses for educators at various Latin American universities, such as the **Autonomous University of Mexico**, the Autonomous University of Chiapas, CONACULTA, the Autonomous University of the West of Cali, the **Pontifical Javeriana University**, the Santiago de Cali University, the University of Valle del Cauca in Colombia, and the **University of Azuay in Cuenca (Ecuador)**. He also conducted various online seminars with the **San Martín de Porres University in Lima (Peru)** and discussions with the University of Cuyo in Argentina.

Invited by the **International Radio Biennial of Mexico**, he conducted a specialized seminar on Transmedia Radio Production and several talks and lectures during its 10th edition in October 2014 in its venues in Mexico City (**Autonomous University of Mexico and CONACULTA**) and Tuxla Gutierrez (Autonomous University of Chiapas). He was also part of the international jury in the Radiodrama category of that Biennial.
